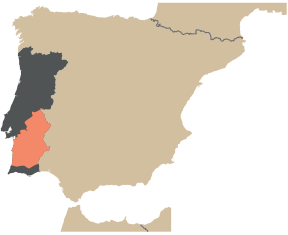




## Bilontra – Red Blend



COUNTRY: Portugal  
REGION: Vinho Regional  
Alentejano  
SOIL: Granite and schist  
with clay and limestone

- Alcohol content: 13.5%
- Brix at harvest: 24.3°
- pH: 3.7
- Acidity: 5.7

*Bilontra is an old word in Portuguese, used to describe someone with a charming and playful attitude. Similarly, the rich fruit and spice aromas of this delicious full bodied wine will charm anyone who tries it.*

### Background:

Alentejano's winemaking history goes back to the Phoenicians and Romans, who were already producing wine in the 7th century B.C.

The climate of the region is typically warm and dry for a large part of the year, with summer temperatures occasionally reaching up to 40°C, while winters are relatively mild and wet. The region's soils are mainly granite and schist, with a few pockets of clay and limestone.



### Vinho Regional Alentejano:

The Vinho Regional designation Alentejano is a geographical, historical and cultural region of south central Portugal. This is one of the most respected wine regions in the country, as it has been key to the renaissance of Portugal's wine scene.

It's best known for its red wines.

### Tasting notes:

- An intense ruby red color and a violet shaded rim at first sight. Notes of well ripened fruit and brown spices on the nose. Palate-coating richness of blueberry, plum and often a subtle stimulating flavor of violet. Smooth and medium bodied.

### Grape variety

Trincadeira, Aragonez, Castelão.

### Vinification

Night harvested and cold macerated before fermenting.
